White Goods and Electronic Waste White goods, like household appliances, and electronic waste will be collected on Monday, October 17, 2022.

REMINDER: each white good or electronic item placed at the curb will require a \$20 sticker purchased from the Town Clerk and will be on sale until October 13th.

Once your ticket has been purchased, call WM with the sticker number(s) the week prior to collection to notify them what white goods or electronic waste you'll be placing at the curb. WM (800) 972-4545.

NO CALLS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER FRIDAY, OCTOBER 14TH 2 P.M.

YOU MAY PURCHASE YOUR STICKERS ANYTIME PRIOR TO THE OCTOBER 13, 2022 AND CAN PICKUP DURING THE TOWN CLERKS NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS.

# Conservation Easements Panel and Q&A on Wednesday, Oct. 12 at 5pm



Panelists include a conservation easement holder and expert:

- Hal Bodwell, a former dairy farmer and conservation easement owner who has conservation easements in both East Kingston and Kensington
- Jeremy Lougee, Senior Conservation Project Manager & Farmland Coordinator at Southeast Land Trust of New Hampshire (SELT), which has conserved tens of thousands of acres, including Bodwell Farm and Monahan Farm.

- 3. Have the opportunity to ask questions
- 4. Take home conservation easement materials


### Pollinator Pathways NH
