
## East Kingston's Karen Cumings Named Girl Scout Volunteer of the Month

It's Girl Scout Cookie season, and that's a gargantuan feat of organization among thousands of

volunteers and Girl Scouts to coordinate. One of those outstanding volunteers is East Kingston resident Karen Cumings, leader of Troop 59300 in Kingston and a Community Product Sales Coordinator for Girl Scouts of the Green and White Mountains, the council serving girls across New Hampshire and Vermont. Cumings was named the council's Volunteer of the Month for February.

"Karen has been awesome for us!" said Lauren McFarland, Product and Marketing Specialist for the council. "She stepped up and distributed materials for cookies to (her troops)," noting that Cumings saved many troop leaders from having to drive out to Bedford to get their cookie sale materials and was excited to begin the cookie program.



Cumings said the key to making it work is constant communication with the leaders in her area, which encompasses Plaistow, Atkinson, Hampstead, Newton, Kingston, Danville, Sandown, and Fremont.

Her troop has used cookie proceeds to pay for camporees, trips, and other activities. She wants to make sure that no one is left out of these experiences for lack of funds. Her girls are just now making their own decisions about how to use those funds.

Troop 59300 is a large group of Girl Scouts ranging from kindergarten through sixth grade. They've camped at Pawtuckaway State Park and Camp Seawood in Portsmouth, and enjoy helping their community.

Cumings said she relies heavily on her co-leader Robyn Carroll, and the parents who volunteer to make things work.

Girl Scouts of the Green and White Mountains said they are proud to have Karen Cumings as part of its team, and to call her Volunteer of the Month.

If a family member drops off an absentee ballot with the town clerk, an Absentee Ballot Return Form must be completed by the person returning the absentee ballot.

#### Warrant #16

As many are aware, The EK Conservation Commission has been working on a project to restore the riverbank on the Powwow. This is a town-owned parcel that is accessed at the end of Troll Way, off of Route 107A. It's an area familiar to kayakers and fishing enthusiasts as well as those just seeking to cool off on a hot summer day.

East Kingston has limited public access to the Powwow pond, and this restoration project has been engineered to create an appealing family recreation area, with retaining structures to prevent future erosion. The Defensible Space Theory has shown that people care for and protect spaces that they feel invested in. Removing decaying trees and adding attractive native planting such as blueberries, butterfly weed, and willows, adding stairway access to the pond, and creating a tribute/memorial brick patio will create aesthetic appeal and easier access.

The project was put out for public bid, but only received one response at a cost that was higher than anticipated. It is the wish of the Conservation Commission to keep costs as low as possible, and we will be requesting more contractors to bid on a second bid request so we may have comparisons.

- Warrant Article #16 requests up to \$115,000 bond for this project. Though we hope the future bids will be significantly lower, in the event that they are not, we're requesting approval of this amount to see this project to completion.
- Cost to residents = 29 cents per thousand in property tax valuation, which is \$2.30 per year for households with \$7,000 annual tax valuation.

For less than the cost of a dozen eggs per household per year, we can create a beautiful oasis for residents that will last for generations. #### Warrant #4

At the town Deliberative Session February 4, 2023, East Kingston voters approved, by 39-2, a \$4 million bond warrant article to acquire conservation easements over the next 20 years. Prior to the Public Hearing and Deliberative Session, the town's Select Board had also voted, 3-0, to approve the warrant article.

The proposed conservation bond will appear as Article 4 on the East Kingston town ballot Tuesday, March 14.

A similar warrant article 20 years ago has helped fund 16 East Kingston conservation easements, the most recent being Monahan Farm, a century-old pick-your-own berry farm and vegetable farm stand at the intersection of U.S. Routes 107 and 108.

Dennis Quintal, East Kingston Conservation Commission (EKCC) chair, said that funds from the 2003 East Kingston Conservation Fund have protected 600 acres of land and prevented the addition of another 128 houses in East Kingston.

# An explanation of Warrant Article 4 by Joe Cacciatore, Board of Selectmen

To the voters of East Kingston:

Land Protection Warrant Article.

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four million dollars (\$4,000,000) for the acquisition of conservation easements or open space lands by the Town, all for permanent protection of appropriate undeveloped land in the Town of East Kingston; four million dollars (\$4,000,000) to be raised through bonds or notes in compliance with the Municipal Finance Act (RSA 33: et seq., as amended) to authorize the Select Board to apply for, obtain and accept federal, state of other aid, if any, which may be available for said project and to comply with all laws applicable to said project.

Having bonding authority in hand will enable the Town to respond in a more timely manner when a landowner who wishes to protect their property from future development comes forward with a proposal to put a conservation easement on their property, and also provides leverage when applying for matching grants from State or Federal sources to aid in the acquisition of easements. We need to stress that bonds or notes would be acquired only on an as needed basis when a specific parcel is proposed for protection and we along with the Conservation Commission feel that it would be in the best interest of the Town to protect any given parcel from development.

This Land Protection Warrant is a tool to protect our growth rate. The public should be aware if our population continues to grown our Fire, Police and Road Agent budgets will increase which will become a burden on the residents in taxes.
