The East Kingston Planning Board and the East Kingston Zoning Board of Adjustment are seeking interested town residents to serve as alternate members on the Planning Board and the Zoning Board of Adjustment. Alternate members will participate as voting members when a regular member is absent or unable to serve on any matter. Alternate members are encouraged to attend all meetings to keep themselves informed of current cases and to familiarize themselves with board procedure; however, this is not required.

The Planning Board meets on the third Thursday of each month to hear and act on applications for home occupations, subdivisions, site plan reviews, and other land-related matters including updating the Master Plan, zoning ordinances, and subdivision and site plan review regulations. Experience is not required as the board receives technical advice on most matters.

The Zoning Board of Adjustment meets on a as-needed basis and reserves the fourth Thursday of the month for their meetings. This board hears and acts on requests for special exceptions, variances, equitable waivers from dimensional requirements, and appeals from administrative decisions.

Gratitude from the Library

In May, Zoe and I travelled to the New Hampshire Library Trustee Association (NHLTA) conference in Concord. We tagged along with many of the library Trustees that sit on the board here in East Kingston. Now I know it is confusing sometimes to know the structure of the library; sometimes in a small town it is hard to understand who does what.. Do the Selectmen make the decisions?...what about the Friends of the Library?

New Hampshire libraries are not town departments subject to jurisdiction and review by the select board. The Board of Trustees are the sole governing body of the library, and is made up of five (5) members and up to three (3) alternates. Every year in March, you vote for one or more Library Trustees to take the vacant spot. The Board of Trustees are "entrusted" with the running of the library. They meet once a month to review financial reports, directors reports and make important decisions about the library. There is a Treasurer who overseas finances and prepares monthly reports and well as dealing with the yearly audit. The secretary is responsible for the monthly meeting minutes and the Chairperson is responsible for communicating about and the running of the monthly meeting. To vote on anything, a quorum must be present.

In this era of overly busy lives, the Trustees devote time and energy to their community. They receive no stipend, so they volunteer their time to keep the library running smoothly. I wanted to use my section of the newsletter this month to thank them. It is not an easy job and they take it seriously. They were willing to spend a day at a conference to learn better how to do their jobs. I appreciate them greatly.





Town Clerk/Tax Collector News

2022 1st half property tax bills were mailed on Monday, May 16, 2022. The due date is July 1, 2022. Impending lien notices for outstanding 2021 property taxes were mailed on Monday, May 16, 2022. The lien date is scheduled for June 17, 2022.

As of this date, we still have over 150 unlicensed dogs. Late fees will begin in June as well as civil forfeiture fines. Dogs were due to be licensed by the end of April. Please license your dog(s) to avoid additional fees. If you no longer own the dog, could you please let us know.

We are now accepting credit cards in the Town Clerk/Tax Collector office. We will be adding this service as well to our online renewal program in the next few weeks.

Reminder: NH voters only have until May 31, 2022 to change their party affiliation before the State Primary Election. To change your affiliation, contact our office or attend a scheduled meeting of your local supervisors of the checklist. If you do not know which party you are registered under, look it up on https://app.sos.nh.gov/voterinformation or check with our office.
