A Letter to Residents

The East Kingston Solid Waste and Recycling Committee wishes to remind Town residents that the continued success of the Town's recycling efforts hinges on the cooperation of all Town residents. We all should be proud of the recycling efforts accomplished over the last 18 years.

As you are aware, solid waste disposal and recycling continues to be a major issue for all communities and it can be costly to execute. We do have strategies to attempt to reduce these costs. One of them is to provide feedback to residents with reminders when issues are determined.

Our Town has separate pick-ups for bulk waste, white goods and electronic waste. These are outlined in the "Town of East Kingston Trash, Recycling, Collection Services" brochure which each household receives in April and <u>posted on the Towns website</u>.

As described in the brochure, we have a comprehensive process to deal with various household products whether they be placed in the recycle bucket or the waste bucket or held for the bulk waste, white goods and electronic pickups slated throughout the year.

Waste Management, our vendor, has their trucks outfitted with video cameras recording what goes into the hopper and rear of the truck. Based on a recent audit, it was noted that there were common violations of what is permitted to go into the respective recycling buckets. It was found that 288 of 824 stops on a recent recycling date found that plastic bags were placed in the buckets. Styrofoam was another item in many of the recycle buckets. These are not permitted to be recycled. Plastic bags can be combined and returned to your local grocery store for recycling and Styrofoam needs to be directed to the waste bucket.

In other situations, a small portable air conditioner, shop vac, plastic toys, metal rods, wood slats, rope and clothing were placed in recycle buckets. These are clearly not permitted for recycling.

To further explain, the fee for tonnage paid by the Town for normal trash pickups is less than the rate for recycling pickups. The Town receives a credit against the recycling pickup rate that usually reduces the tonnage cost to a lower rate. However, when items that cannot be recycled are placed in the recycle bucket, the tonnage weight is skewed to the higher rate, which in turn increases costs to the Town that are then passed on in our tax rate. So it is important to put trash where it belongs and not in the recycle bucket.

With everyone's cooperation, we can continue to deal with our waste in a positive manner to everyone's benefit.

September 18, 2023 Fall Bulk Waste Pickup

The Bulk Waste pickup requires a sticker system such as the one we use for White Goods. Each household will be allowed 2 free stickers and may purchase additional stickers for \$20 each. They must pick them up at the Town Clerks Office during normal business hours-(603) 642-8406 Option #2. The Town Clerks Office hours are Monday: 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday: 8 a.m.-2:30 p.m. Wednesday: 5 p.m.-7 p.m. A log will be kept to record each household that picks up their free stickers as well as any purchased. Bulky items are defined below; any other items will not be picked up even if they have a sticker. Bulky Waste is defined as a large item or bundle, other than commercial construction and demolition debris, hazardous waste, White Goods or CRT's, which cannot fit into a cart. Items shall include, but not be limited to tables, chairs, couches, bed frames, mattresses, bedsprings, grills, lawnmowers (without fuel tank), bathroom fixtures, etc. Refer to your flyer or the Town of East Kingston website for more information.

Maplevale residents on side streets need to bring bulky items out to Maplevale Road.

Cricket Hill is a private road with limited access for large trucks and will not participate in Bulk Waste Collection.

Saving our Beautiful White Ash Tree

An invasive insect, the Emerald Ash Borer, has been infesting and killing ash trees around the country. A town warrant article in 2019 established the \$5,000 Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) fund to ensure we identified and took measures to save our highest-value White Ash trees on town land.

The East Kingston Conservation Commission, which oversees the fund, is using those monies to proactively treat the town's beautiful ash tree in Union Cemetery on South Road to prevent Emerald Ash Borer infestation and probable mortality.

These preventative trunk injection treatments are done every two years (based on the beetle's life cycle) and were completed in 2021 and 2023, for a total cost of \$761. Today, \$4,239 remains in the fund. Fortunately, the tree appears healthy, with no sign of the invasive pest; i.e., no crown die-back or bark "blonding" from woodpeckers feeding on the EAB larvae.
